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Latvian Gambit Openings

Latvian Gambit. The Latvian Gambit is a very aggressive opening defense for black against one of the more common openings for white. This opening is not seen much at master level chess as most masters refuse to give up material early on in a game. Below master level play there are strong advocates of the Latvian Gambit and I personally enjoy the possibilities that arise from this opening.

Latvian Gambit - Chess Openings

The Latvian Gambit (or Greco Countergambit) is a chess opening

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characterised by the moves: 1. e4 e5 2. Nf3 f5?! It is one of the oldest chess openings, having been analysed in the 17th century by Gioachino Greco, after whom it is sometimes named. The opening has the appearance of a King's Gambit with colours reversed. It is an aggressive but rather dubious choice for Black which often leads to wild and tricky positions.

The Latvian Gambit is an uncommon King's Pawn Opening that begins 1. e4 e5 2. Nf3 f5!? Nf3 f5!? This pawn sacrifice is an aggressive attempt from black to take control of the game, immediately putting the question to white's e4 pawn.

Before we start the discussion about the Latvian Gambit (1 e4 e5 2 Nf3 f5), I have a confession to make. I never really trusted in this opening. It is one thing to play a risky King's Gambit and it is a totally different thing to play the same King's Gambit being a tempo down (I am sure most of the readers noted that if we look at the position after 1.e4 e5 2. f4 Nf6 and ask Black to play a second move in a row, then it will be exactly the Latvian Gambit with reversed colors).

The Latvian Gambit is a controversial, trappy but dubious gambit which begins 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 f5. Black's idea is to generate an unbalanced game with attacking chances, by playing a sort of reversed King's Gambit. If White plays e4xf5 or Black gets in ...f5xe4, Black can hope to generate an attack down the half-open f-file.

Perhaps the most popular of all gambits for Black, the Latvian Gambit has a long history of provoking theoretical debate. While the Latvian (1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 f5) is now seen as unsound by most authorities, there's no doubting that it is an extremely difficult

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opening for unprepared opponents to meet.
